After school/ Holiday clubs. Increase number of after school clubs	<ul> <li>Running after school/holiday clubs will:</li> <li>Engage children in exercise outside curriculum requirements.</li> <li>Provide children with the opportunity to further develop skills.</li> <li>Forge links with local sports groups.</li> <li>Develop relationships between school and parents (parents could be invited to take part in clubs).</li> <li>Gives children the opportunity to participate in a range of new sporting activities such as dodgeball, dance, gymnastics, yoga and football.</li> </ul>	£3000 initially allocated to subsidise the running costs of these clubs.
Training for staff through courses and the use of a sports coach for 2 days a week.	<ul> <li>Providing training for staff will help to:</li> <li>Improve staff confidence in delivering high quality PE lessons.</li> <li>Ensure staff are meeting curriculum requirements.</li> <li>Up skill staff to deliver high quality PE.</li> </ul>	Costs dependent on the course provider.  Coach for the year - £4,000

Purchase new/ additional equipment and replace any old equipment.	The purchase of new/additional equipment and resources will:  - Enthuse children within their lessons.  - Allow staff the opportunity to develop children's skills.  - Provide children with the chance to try out new activities.	£500

Curriculum enrichment days.	<ul> <li>Buying in companies to run enrichment days will:</li> <li>Provide the children with the opportunity to experience different activities that school cannot/does not provide.</li> <li>Allow staff to try out a range of activities that they could build into their planning.</li> <li>Enthuse children, staff and parents to try new activities.</li> </ul>	£250 per session (approx.)
Purchase PE kit.	<ul> <li>Purchasing additional PE kit will:</li> <li>Raise participation levels – all year groups to be given access to spare PE kit for children who forget theirs.</li> <li>Regular non-participants (for not having kit) to be given kit.</li> <li>To be monitored ½ termly by PE Coordinator – see action plan for further explanation.</li> </ul>	£500
Transport costs.	Being able to provide transport will:  - Ensure access to competitions being held at other venues.  - Allow children to attend development activities (day events etc).	Varies dependent upon location of event and size of bus required.

Throughout the year there may also be other uses for the fund including:

- Covering cost for using specialist teachers for specific sports.
- Buying refreshments for children during sports day.
- Buying refreshments for schools taking part in events held at Pinfold Street.
